1. Modifications/Changes to Agenda

2. Public Comment

Pauline Loiselle, resident of the village, has offered to assist with the planting of flowers in the Village's planters.

3. Review/Approve Minutes for April 28th, 2026, and Special meeting held May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026.

A motion was made by David Gervais to approve the minutes for April 28, 2026, and May 1, 2026, as presented. Seconded by Jason Longway. Unanimous

4. Allocation request for 27 Bismark St, water and wastewater.

David Gervais made a motion to approve two wastewater and water allocations for 27 Bismark Street, Enosburg Falls. Seconded by Leonard Charron. Unanimous

5. Discuss wastewater funds and a motion

Laurie Stanley reviewed the memo provided regarding wastewater allocations payments received between 2022 and 2025. From this review the board made the following motions:

Jason Longway made a motion to retroactively authorize the transfer of wastewater allocation funds previously made as follows \$150,000.00 to the vacuum truck savings account and \$17,460.00 reallocated from the truck replacement savings account to the vacuum truck savings account. Seconded by Leonard Charron. Unanimous

Leonard Charron made a motion to approve the allocation of \$156,740.75 in prior wastewater-related expenditures as an allowable use of restricted wastewater funds in accordance with auditor guidance and Village ordinance. Seconded by David Gervais. Unanimous

Jason Longway made a motion to authorize the transfer of the remaining balance of \$92,657.69 from the operating checking account to the restricted wastewater savings account to bring the fund into compliance with ordinance requirements. Seconded by Leonard Charron. Unanimous.

6. Review quotes for leased Wastewater pickup truck

There are no quotes currently.

7. Approve the annual Dairy Days park permit.

Jason Longway approved the Dairy Day permits; waving the fees. Seconded by David Gervais.

8. Manager Minutes

- AMI integration should be completed by July 1, 2026. Billing software has been going well. The financial software upgrade is on track for going live in September 2026.
- The paving of Main Street and Elm Street is scheduled for end of June, first part of July.
- Pearl Street Sidewalk project is on track. All easements are being filed with town clerk, and the lawyer needs to complete a couple of items. The village's part in the project is moving the fire hydrant on the corner of Church and Pearl Street.
- A finance director has been hired. An announcement will be made once they have informed their current employer.
- The Public Works Dept. has moved the fountain pump to a vault, replumbed and wired. The Electric Dept. installed new lighting under the bandstand.
- Installation of the patriotic banners has started.

9. Other Business

- The Village Clerk has received a petition for a Vote on the SBS ordinance. She is currently reviewing the signatures that they are registered village voters.
- David Gervais asked about the garbage near the rail trail on Pleasant Street. John will have the Public Works Dept. remove it.
